MHA and hospitals and health systems from across Minnesota are working together to achieve positive health outcomes for moms and babies statewide.

On Sept. 14, MHA will host the second Healthy Moms and Babies Summit where an interdisciplinary group of hospital and health system care teams and leaders will collaboratively learn and share best practices in care provided to moms and babies in Minnesota.

This virtual summit will serve as a platform for sharing best practices, innovations and updates from hospitals and health systems throughout the state. In addition, we are excited to welcome Dr. Matthew Grossman from Yale School of Medicine and Yale-New Haven Children's Hospital to speak on the Eat, Sleep, Console method as an alternative treatment method for infants with neonatal abstinence syndrome (NAS).

All Minnesota hospitals and health systems are welcome to attend. MHA strongly encourages health care sites that provide labor and delivery services to invite interdisciplinary teams of physicians, nurses, quality personnel and operational leaders to attend.

- Review updates that have been made to the MHA NAS road map since its initial launch in 2019
- Understand the Eat, Sleep, Console method of treatment for infants impacted by NAS
- Review the background, implementation and lessons learned from hospitals and health systems that participated in the MHA Plan of Safe Care Pilot
- Recognize where disparities in maternal care exist and review best practices to combat them
- Analyze infant mortality data and learn how to improve reporting on maternal mortality

Who should attend

Interdisciplinary obstetric care teams from birthing hospitals and health systems across Minnesota, including physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, midwives, nursing, quality personnel and operational leaders.
